- a. For English Composition I, ENGL 111 (English Composition I) and English Composition II, ENGL 112 (English Composition II) are the recommended classes to meet the General Education Writing Requirement.
- b. Students must include at least three different disciplines from the Mindset Courses options. At least 3cr must be at the 300-level.
- c. Students must choose 18cr of electives from within one of the following concentrations:
 - Global Health
 - Global Justice and Inequality
 - Communities, Conflict, and Human Flourishing
 - Border Crossings and Migration
 - Environment, Energy, and Innovation
 - Global Human Origins
 - Security and Diplomacy

Elective courses must include at least two different disciplines. At least 9cr must be at the 300 level or higher and at least an additional 3cr must be at the 400 level. See list of concentration electives below.
- d. Degree requirements in Arts & Sciences include a minimum of 40 credits of 300/400 level courses (excluding workshops) consisting of either:
 - Upper level (300/400) courses both in and outside the student's major
 - Any courses outside the major department as specified in and approved by the student's major department chair (permission should be obtained prior to enrollment) except workshops
 - If requirement has been satisfied by previous coursework, credits should still be filled as general electives.
