

“OUT” OF THE ARCHIVES: EXPLORING AKRON’S LGBTQ+ HISTORY

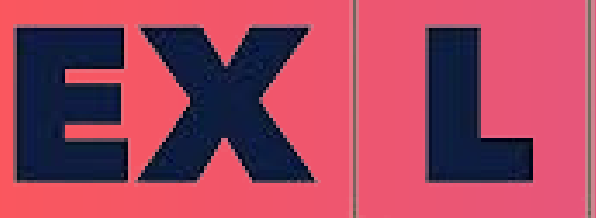

Aided by contextual research and community outreach, they will share their findings publicly and work to ethically create resources for others seeking access to the Rubber City’s queer stories. 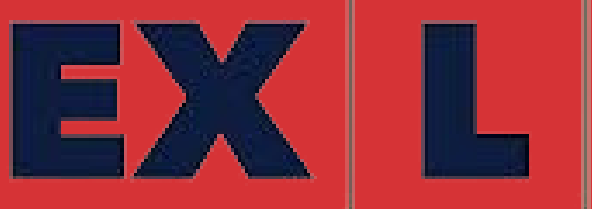

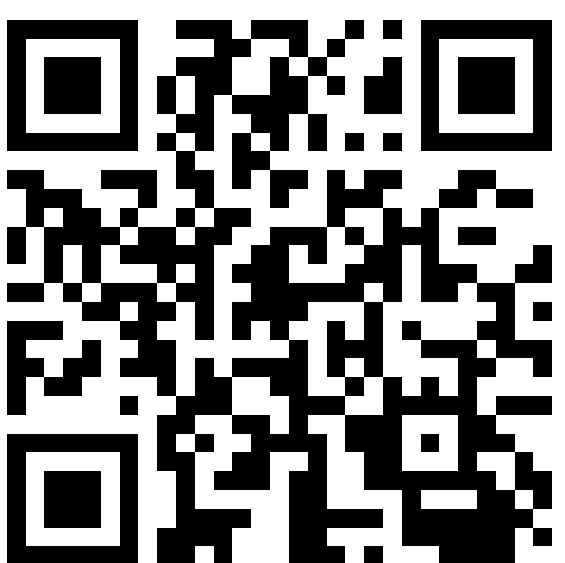
